Ans. Accounting is a systematic process of identifying, recording, classifying, summarizing, interpreting and communicating financial information. It reveals profit or loss for a given period, and the value and nature of a firm's assets, liabilities and owners' equity.

Ans. Amount of Depreciation = $\frac{\text{Cost of Machine} - \text{Scrap Value of Machine}}{\text{Life in Years}}$

$$\begin{aligned} &= \frac{1,20,000 - 72,000}{4} \\ &= \text{Rs } 12,000 \end{aligned}$$

Rate of Depreciation = $\frac{\text{Amount of Depreciation} \times 100}{\text{Cost of Machine}}$ = $\frac{12,000 \times 100}{1,20,000}$ = 10%p.a.

Ans. Bookkeeping involves the recording, on a regular basis, of a company's financial transactions. With proper bookkeeping, companies are able to track all information on its books to make key operating, investing, and financing decisions.

Bookkeepers are individuals who manage all financial data for companies. Without bookkeepers, companies would not be aware of their current financial position, as well as the transactions that occur within the company.

Ans. Difference Between Double Entry System and Single Entry System is as follows:

The single entry system is a method of recording financial transactions in an organization where only a single entry is filed after an operation which can be either a debit or a credit concerning the nature of the transaction.

The double entry system is a method bookkeeping where for every debit entry there is a corresponding credit entry, and for every credit entry, there is a similar debit entry.

The single entry system is a simple method that does not requires skills and knowledge to implement while the double-entry method of bookkeeping is a sophisticated method that requires skills and expertise to accomplish.

Single entry system cannot be used to prepare trial balance and profit and loss account which means that it cannot help show the financial position of the country while double entry system is useful when making a trial balance and statement of financial situation for the enterprise.

Other differences between single entry and double entry system include complexity, accounts maintained, and detection of errors among others.



Q.2.What is the principle of Consistency in Accounts.

Ans. The consistency principle states that, once you adopt an accounting principle or method, continue to follow it consistently in future accounting periods so that the results reported from period to period are comparable.

However, companies can change an accounting principle or method if the new version in some way improves the usefulness of the reported financial results. For instance, GAAP allows for several different ways of valuing inventory (goods held for sale in the ordinary course of business.)

For instance, During the first nine months of fiscal 2021, Home Decors implemented a new enterprise resource planning (“ERP”) system, including a new inventory system, for its retail operations in India and changed its method of accounting for inventory for its retail operations in India from the lower of cost (first-in, first-out) or market, as determined by the retail inventory method, to the lower of cost or market using a weighted-average cost method. This was disclosed, as required by GAAP, in the footnotes to the audited financial statements.

Q.3. What is the difference between Straight line method and Written down Method of depreciation?

Ans.

Straight line method

Depreciation is calculated on the original cost of an asset.

Equal amount of depreciation is charged each year over the useful life of the asset.

Book value of the asset becomes zero at the end of its effective life.

It is suitable for the assets such as patents, copyright, land and buildings which have lesser possibility of obsolescence and lesser repair charges.

As depreciation remains same over the years but repair cost increases in the later years, there will be unequal effect over the life of the asset.

It is not recognized under the income tax act.

Written down value method

Depreciation is calculated on the reducing balance, i.e., the book value of an asset.

Diminishing amount of depreciation is charged each year over the useful life of the asset.

Book value of the asset can never be zero.

It is suitable for assets which needs more repair in the later years such as plant and machinery, car.

As depreciation cost is high and repairs are less in the initial years but in the later years the repair costs increase and depreciation cost decreases, there will be equal effect over the life of the asset.

It is recognized under the income tax act.

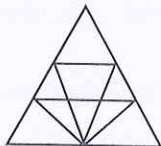

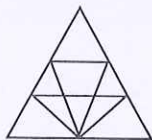
